Marine Systems, Inc. Quote

Utility Director Hagerman is requesting approval of a sole source procurement for parts and service to re-seal one of the larger generators (EMD 20-1) used to provide reliable power during hydro power outages (both planned and unplanned). The vendor, Marine Services, Inc., is the only Pacific Northwest provider of parts and service for EMD generators and has proven to have the necessary expertise and factory parts inventory in previous work performed for PMPL. Marine Services, Inc. has quoted \$82,595.96 to provide the service.

Local Fish Processing Workers Asymptomatic COVID Testing Memorandum of Agreement Attachments: EOC IC Hagerman Memo Asymptomatic COVID Testing Memorandum of Agreement COVID Testing Agreement with Processor Exhibit A - Asymptomatic COVID Testing Request Form Petersburg's local processors have done an excellent job of isolating and testing incoming transient workers, but the local workforce is now seen as a potential weak point in their efforts to keep COVID-19 away from their plants and businesses. EOC Incident Commander Hagerman is recommending approval of a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Borough and Petersburg Medical Center (PMC) to provide asymptomatic testing of resident fish processor workers. The Borough would use CARES Act funds to cover the expenses incurred by PMC for providing the service. The total estimated value of the MOA with PMC is \$177,800. Suggested motion: to approve the Asymptomatic COVID Testing Memorandum of Agreement with PMC and the COVID Testing Agreement with Processor with Exhibit A in substantially the same form as published in this meeting packet. D. Letter to ADOT Regarding the Kake Access Road Project Attachments: Response to ADOT re Kake Access Road Project 4.13.2020 ADOT Letter to Borough re Kake Access Road Project Manager Giesbrecht received a letter from ADOT&PF submitting plans to the Borough for the Kake Access Road Project per State Statute AS 35.30.020 which orders the Department to comply with local planning and zoning ordinances and other regulations for their projects. The Borough's reply notifies ADOT&PF there are no Petersburg Borough planning and zoning ordinances applicable to the proposed project.
