Utility Director Hagerman Supplemental Budget Request

Bids received for the Scow Bay 1 Pump Station Upgrade project placed expenses over and above the ADEC loan amount secured for the project. If approved, Ordinance #2019-13 will transfer Wastewater Department reserves to the Scow Bay 1 Pump Station Upgrade capital project fund in order to make an award to the lowest responsive bidder. The Wastewater Department will be preparing a loan increase application for ADEC's consideration with the goal of returning this supplemental funds transfer amount of \$194,695 back to department reserves when the loan increase for the project is approved. Employee Compensation Study Quote

Assembly Member Lynn requested a quote for an employee compensation study as negotiations with the Petersburg Municipal Employees Association (PMEA) will commence in early 2020 for a new 3-year collective bargaining agreement. Manager Giesbrecht reached out to 3 companies, 2 of which have not responded. A quote was received from Public Sector Personnel Consultants to complete a compensation and benefit study for a price not to exceed \$22,500. If approved by the Assembly, this study will be used as part of our PMEA negotiations and to discuss Department Head salary comparisons. L. NMFS Meeting Regarding the Humpback Whale Critical Habitat Proposed Rule

In response to the Assembly's letter to the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) requesting a hearing be held in Petersburg regarding the Humpback Whale Critical Habitat Proposed Rule, Mayor Jensen was contacted by NOAA Fisheries Endangered Species Division National Listing Coordinator, Lisa Manning. Ms. Manning is inquiring whether Petersburg wants a public hearing or a public meeting held. At a public hearing, members of the public in attendance could submit oral comments on the proposed rule, and those comments would be recorded. NMFS would then consider and respond to these comments in the final rule. At a public meeting, comments would not be recorded or captured verbatim, but would be considered general notes and would be retained for NMFS's administrative record. Ms. Manning is considering December 5th or 6th for this meeting, and due to the Assembly/Hospital Board work session scheduled for December 5th, the 6th seems like the best choice. The Assembly is asked to choose public hearing or public meeting and to approve December 6th as the date for it to be held. The time for the hearing/meeting will need to be determined at a later date to account for NMFS's travel schedule, etc.
