Ordinance #2017-02: An Ordinance Amending Petersburg Municipal Code Chapter 2.44, Initiative and Referendum, To Change The Timing Requirements To Submit Matters Proposed By Initiative Or Referendum To The Qualified Voters Of The Borough So That They Are The Same As Submitting A Proposed Charter Amendment To The Voters, And To Remove Any Mandate Of Holding A Special Election

If adopted, Ordinance #2017-02 will clean up differing time requirements to submit matters proposed by initiative or referendum to the qualified voters of the Borough between the Borough Code and Borough Charter. It will also remove any mandate to hold a special election for certified sufficient petitions, and will instead instruct the Clerk to submit the matter to the voters at the next regular or special election occurring more than 90 days after the Clerk's certification.
