Public Works Director Hagerman submitted and reviewed his written report.

Board Member Stearns asked if the water plant was keeping up with demand. Hagerman responded that they are. Discussion.

Thynes asked what contributed to the concrete cracking on the downtown paving job. Hagerman responded that the slabs were poured and due to the unusually warm weather, the sub-contractors did not get the relief cutting done quickly enough.

Thynes asked about the route the trucks hauling dredging from the North Harbor will be taking. Hagerman responded that all the dredge spoils will be hauled on the Airport Bypass Road. Discussion.

Roughness on Dolphin Street: Hagerman and DOT Engineers have pushed to get the surface of lower Dolphin Street resurfaced or to get the roughness corrected, but it may end up that the Borough does not get fully charged for that portion of the project. Board Member Flint asked if there could be long term problems in that area. Hagerman responded that he didn't think so. Discussion.

Commingled Recycling Project: Hagerman reviewed the results of the commingling project including preliminary figures from the customer surveys.
